

# Parent Friendly Guide To Good Behaviour

## Abbey Hill's Five Golden Rules:

We are kind and gentle

We work hard

We listen to people

We are honest

We look after property



 We have 5 Golden Rules which show the children clearly how we expect them to behave. These are on display in all classrooms and around the school.

 We all model good behaviour and teach the children that they are responsible for making the right choices about how they behave.

 We believe children should be rewarded for good behaviour. This is why we use instant

rewards like stickers, Celebration Assembly, and whole class reward schemes.

 Our behaviour scheme is called "It's Good to be Green".

 Every child's name starts on the green band on the class's behaviour chart each morning. If they behave well their name stays on the green band. If they make the wrong choices about their behaviour the teacher will talk to them about the right thing to do. If they carry on making the wrong choices their name moves onto the yellow band, then the orange band and finally the red band. If a child's name is on the orange band they will have 10 minutes' time out in another class with their work. If a child's name is on the red band they will spend time out with the head teacher or deputy head to finish their work. If your child's name is on the red band more than twice in a short period of time we will contact you.



**BUT.....**

If a child carries on behaving in a way that stops other children from learning or if their behaviour is aggressive, disrespectful or abusive to others, they may be at risk of being excluded from school. This could be for a fixed period of time or, in the worst case, permanently. The school will **always** try their hardest to work with children behaving in this way but, in the end, we will put the best interests of the majority of children first.



We expect children to follow the 5 Golden Rules at all times and with any adult in school, not just their teacher. This includes playtimes, lunchtimes, before and after school, at Breakfast Club and after-school clubs. The rules also apply on trips out of school and sports events held at other venues.



For those children who struggle to behave well for different reasons, we will write an individual behaviour plan with targets. If your child needs a plan to help them behave we will share this with you.



Each class has its own midday supervisor who collects the children and takes them to the dining hall or out to play. Children are also supervised as they come in from the playground and wash their hands before eating their lunch. Midday supervisors line up with their class at the end of lunchtime and wait with them until the class teacher arrives. All midday supervisors follow the Golden Rules with the children and talk to teachers about any children who have broken the rules at lunchtime.
